THIS WAS A TSUNAMI!

The real story is the underreported story of the night - the Republican pick ups at the state level.

There will be 18 states subject to reapportionment. The Republicans will control a majority of those - at least ten and maybe a dozen or more. More significantly, a minimum of seventeen state legislative houses have flipped to the Republican Party.

The North Carolina Legislature is Republican for the first time since 1870. Yes, that is Eighteen Seventy.

The Alabama Legislature is Republican for the first time since 1876.

For those saying this is nothing because it is the South, consider these:

The entire Wisconsin and New Hampshire legislatures

have flipped to the GOP by wide margins.

The State Houses in Indiana, Pennsylvania, Michigan, Ohio, Iowa, Montana, and Colorado flipped to the GOP.

The Maine and Minnesota Senates flipped to the GOP.

The Texas and Tennessee Houses went from virtually tied to massive Republican gains. The gains in Texas were so big that the Republicans no longer need the Democrats to get state constitutional amendments out of the state legislature.

These gains go all the way down to the municipal level across the nation. That did not happen even in 1994.

This was a tsunami!

Near the end of 1968, a dismal year of civil rights issues, riots, assassinations and more of the lingering Vietnam War, a Saturn 5 rocket lifted off from Cape Canaveral on mankind's first attempt to reach the moon. Apollo 8 that year held the promise that a free people would not fail after all. Americans coming together could still achieve wonders! God bless us every one as we look forward to holidays with our families and a new year of promise and wonders ahead. Amen.

Earmark Ban a Strong First Step Back to Fiscal Responsibility

Washington, D.C. – Congressman Wally Herger (R-CA) joined House Republicans in supporting an earmark ban for the upcoming 112th Congress. His comments follow below:

The Bright Side

Tuesday night was very successful for Republicans nationwide. We picked up many tough seats in the House and Senate, and won key Governorships across the country. On Wednesday morning, the country had turned red... except for California. The Republican losses in California were particularly painful because of the great candidates that lost and the margins by which they lost. Republicans in California were blindsided. California voters seem to be suffering from some sort of bipolar disorder at the polls- while the Legislature's approval ratings have consistently been at record lows for the past year, every single Legislator that ran for reelection won handily, some moved from Assembly to Senate seats seamlessly. California voters are sick and tired of "politics as usual", yet elected Jerry Brown as Governor- the epitome of "politics as usual". And what is most difficult to understand, while our state is in financial crisis mode, with unemployment at 12%, governmental regulation at an all time high while businesses flee to other states, our voters vote down Prop 24 (which would have repealed corporate tax breaks) and Prop 21 (vehicle tax for state park funding) yet continue to vote in Democrats whose main mission is to tax and spend and support initiatives like Props 21 and 24.

What gives? We Republicans in California did have some small victories, lest we forget. Prop 19 (legalizing marijuana) failed; along with aforementioned Props 21, 24, as well as Prop 27 (would have repealed the redistricting commission). Prop 20 (redistricting Congressional lines) and Prop 26 (requires 2/3rds vote for all levies) are big wins- Prop 26 especially, which will hopefully balance out the effects of Prop 25 (simple majority vote for budget) passing. There are other things to celebrate too. Assemblywoman Connie Conway (R- 34) was named the new Assembly Republican Leader. Assemblywoman Conway is a member of the CFRW and a wonderful friend and ally for the Federation. We are very proud of her accomplishments in the Assembly and look forward to her new leadership role. As the saying goes, there is a bright side to everything. As Republicans in California, it just takes us a little bit longer to recognize it. The outcome of this election just means we have to keep working hard educating, advocating, and taking an active role in our government.

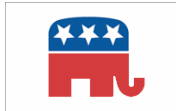
