The Budget Issue

Governor Brown issued his first budget proposal early this week, hoping to fill a \$26.4 billion deficit. To explain it easily, the Governor proposed about \$12 billion in cuts and \$12 billion in taxes. He also proposed another \$2 billion in internal borrowing schemes and "non-tax" revenues. Unfortunately the Governor's \$12 billion in "cuts" really accounts for approximately \$4.5 billion in shifting of funds which are not actually cuts at all. And much like the spending "cuts", the \$12 billion dollars in taxes will actually come out to about \$14 billion in new taxes, including higher income, vehicle and sales taxes.

So, now what? Well, first the non-partisan Legislative Analyst's Office has their say. The LAO stated this week that the Governor's proposal was a "good starting point", but cites many risks. The biggest problem that the LAO foresees is the intricate shifting of funds within the budget, especially shifting services to local governments. Of note, the LAO believes that vehicle taxes should be higher and business tax breaks should be reduced, but argue that higher income and sales taxes would "be difficult issues" to tackle.

Now the Senate and Assembly Budget Committees will meet. They already had their first sessions this week, but there will be many more in the weeks and months to come. Governor Brown will have to argue for his budget proposal, especially for his recommended special election in June to put the issue before the voters of extending for five more years tax hikes set to

expire in 2011. Republicans are already promising to vote against this and thanks to Prop 26, a two-thirds approval will most likely be necessary for this proposal.

Governor Brown has asked the Legislature to come to a budget conclusion by March 1st. Although both houses have promised to put the budget on the "fast-track", speculators say it is highly unlikely that the budget will be resolved by then. The Governor wants the budget done by his timeline so that he can place his tax extension vote on a June ballot. This would require a two-thirds vote from the Legislature, including Republican support. March is an ambitious deadline for the Governor to suggest and the Legislature isn't known for meeting deadlines... Stay tuned to the Capitol Update during this very important budget battle!

Herger Appointed Chairman of Ways and Means Subcommittee on Health

(Washington, D.C) – Congressman Wally Herger (R-CA) today was appointed to be the Chairman of the Ways & Means Subcommittee on Health for the 112th Congress. Herger held the position of Ranking Member on the Health Subcommittee in the 111th Congress. With this appointment, Herger will help lead the effort to repeal ObamaCare and to advance reforms that will actually lower health care costs and increase access to quality care. Congressman Dave Camp (R-MI), Chairman of the Ways & Means Committee, praised Herger for his leadership on health care and offered his congratulations on his new post. Their comments follow below:

"I look forward to working with Chairman Camp, Speaker Boehner and the rest of the new House Leadership to follow the will of the American people and repeal ObamaCare as soon as possible. Since the debate over health care reform began, the American people have

To involve more young women in the political process and to provide educational opportunities, the National Federation of Republican Women (NFRW) offers several scholarships and internships to female students.

NFRW Scholarships

In honor of Nancy Reagan, the NFRW offers three annual \$2,500 National Pathfinder Scholarships for college sophomore, junior, senior, or graduate school women. NFRW also offers three \$1,000 Betty Rendel Scholarships to college junior and senior women who are majoring in political science, government or economics. The recipients are chosen from applicants from across the nation.

Dorothy Andrews Kabis Internship

The Dorothy Andrews Kabis Memorial Internship honors the former president of the NFRW (1963-67) who later was appointed U.S. Treasurer by President Richard Nixon. The internship gives female undergraduates the opportunity to spend part of the summer working at national headquarters in Alexandria, Va. It includes a small monetary allowance, roundtrip airfare to and from Washington, D.C., and housing in the D.C. metropolitan area. Applicants must be at least a junior in college or a college student 21 years of age or older. They should have a general knowledge of government, a keen

interest in politics, campaign experience, and sufficient clerical office skills that are adaptable to a busy office.

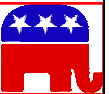

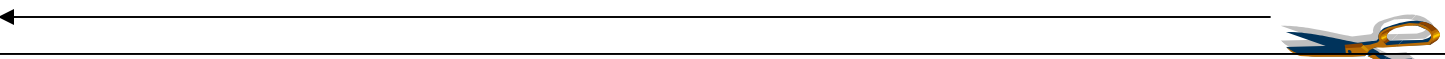
