



More Ballot Measures

Now this is a ballot measure we can get behind! This week the initiative to ban payroll deductions for political spending qualified to be on the November general election ballot. The initiative would prohibit unions and corporations from automatically deducting money from employee's check for political disbursements. It would also include a prohibition on unions, corporations or contractors that currently work for the government from giving to a political candidate's campaigns. This is most commonly called "payroll protection" and it will be on the ballot for the first time since 2005. Stay tuned as more ballot measures qualify for the general election. We must remain informed and educated on the issues!

The SB 48 Fight Is Not Over

Earlier this week the Capitol Resource Institute and other pro-family organizations submitted an initiative to the Attorney General to counter the effects of SB 48. If you will recall, the referendum to repeal SB 48 fell short of the signatures necessary to put the measure on the ballot. But

unfazed by the hurdle, the same organizations have this time filed an initiative effort. They hope to curb some of the harmful effects of SB 48. SB 48 mandates that by 2015 all social science textbooks from Kindergarten to 12th grade include a "gay-history" chapter in publically funded California schools. The initiative will assure "that lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender and other minority figures are not excluded from inclusion in California curriculum while requiring accurate historical portrayals of all individuals." Land Exchange Bill Would Improve Economy in a North State County

Given your interest in federal land management, I wanted to inform you about testimony I recently offered before the House Natural Resources Subcommittee on National Parks, Forests and Public Lands in favor of land exchange legislation that I have introduced, H.R. 1237. This bill would allow the Trinity County Public Utilities District (TPUD) to exchange some of the parcels they own with parcels currently administered by the Bureau of Land Management and the Forest Service. The land exchange would allow TPUD to maximize the economic value of land they own near the Weaverville Airport and enhance job opportunities in the community. Our communities in Northern California face significant

economic challenges because of the amount of land the federal government owns. I strongly believe that these resources belong to the people and that local needs should drive their management. Common-sense land exchanges like H.R. 1237 would have the two-fold benefit of making federal land management more efficient while providing local communities with greater access to their natural resources. I am hopeful that the full House of Representatives will consider this common-sense legislation, and I will continue to strongly support eliminating bureaucratic red tape, improving land management and promoting wide and varied use of our federal lands in Northern California

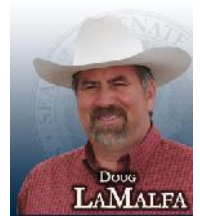

To involve more young women in the political process and to provide educational opportunities, the National Federation of Republican Women (NFRW) offers several scholarships and internships to female students.

NFRW Scholarships

In honor of Nancy Reagan, The NFRW offers three annual \$2,500 National Pathfinder Scholarships for college sophomore, junior, senior, or graduate school women.

NFRW also offers three \$1,000 Betty Rendel Scholarships to college junior and senior women who are majoring in political science, government or economics. The recipients are chosen from applicants from across the nation.

Dorothy Andrews Kabis Internship

The Dorothy Andrews Kabis Memorial Internship honors the former president of the NFRW (1963-67) who later was appointed U.S. Treasurer by President Richard Nixon. The internship gives female undergraduates the opportunity to spend part of the summer working at national headquarters in Alexandria, Va. It includes a small monetary allowance, roundtrip airfare to and from Washington, D.C., and housing in the D.C. metropolitan area. Applicants must be at least a junior in college or a

college student 21 years of age or older. They should have a general knowledge of government, a keen interest in politics, campaign experience, and sufficient clerical office skills that are adaptable to a busy office.

AMERICAN HISTORY PARADE A PRAYER AT VALLEY FORGE

During the long winter of 1777-78, when the Patriot army camped at Valley Forge, George Washington shared the hardships suffered by his men. He spent much of his time rounding up food, begging the Continental Congress for supplies, and bolstering the troops' spirits. His presence kept the army from disintegrating.

Tradition holds that one cold January day, Isaac Potts, a Quaker farmer who lived near Valley Forge, was walking through the woods when he heard a low, solemn voice. Stealing quietly in its direction, he found a riderless horse tied to a sapling. The farmer crept nearer and through the trees, saw a lone man on his knees in the snow.

It was General Washington. Tears marked his face as he bowed his head and asked God to look after his men.

At home that evening the farmer told his wife of the encounter. "All will be well, Martha," he said. "If there is anyone the Lord will listen to, it is this brave man. I have seen General Washington on his knees. Our independence is certain."

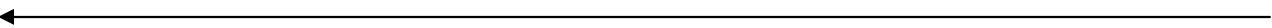
