2011 PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

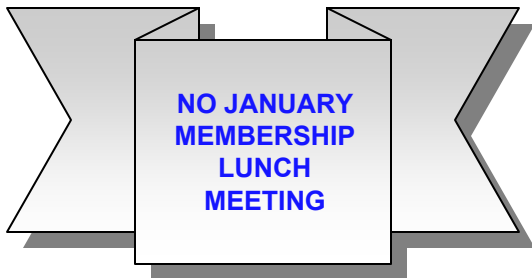
Greetings, Ladies of our TCRWF!

There Ought Not To Be A Law!

Around this time every year, many of our Legislators hold a contest within their districts called, "There Ought To Be A Law". The challenge for the constituents is to write a law that is not already in place that they believe should be a law. While this "cute" contest may have helped newly elected representatives become in-tune with their constituency, it is now a superfluous competition. The state Assembly and Senate create and introduce approximately 3,000 bills a year. To counteract the bill factory approach most law-makers take, Senator Doug La Malfa (R-4) has come up with his own contest, "There Ought Not To Be A Law"! If you are a member of the 4th Senate District, you can enter the contest. The deadline is January 10, 2011.

Senator La Malfa is a true small government, fiscal conservative and we are lucky to have him represent us!

Redistricting Commission Selected

The remaining 6 members were selected for the Redistricting Commission and the group got right to work this week on the organization of the commission. The 14 member commission now has until August 15th of next year to redraw our state's assembly, senate and congressional districts. The maps must be approved by nine of the 14 members, including three Democrats, three Republicans and three affiliated with a third party or Decline to State. We will be keeping a close eye on this process and proposed maps will be made public as the year continues, so stay tuned!

REPORT FROM WASHINGTON

**Abandonment of “Omnibus” a Victory
 for American Taxpayers**

Knowing of your interest in the federal budget and fiscal responsibility, I wanted to inform you that Senate Majority Leader Harry Reid last night pulled the plug on a \$1.1 trillion “omnibus” spending bill, which would have combined separate appropriations measures into a single package to fund federal agencies during the current fiscal year (FY 2011). The 2,000-page bill was the latest example of the Democrat majority’s disregard for fiscal responsibility, having previously failed to pass a budget or enact a single one of the twelve annual spending measures. It included nearly 7,000 earmarks totaling over \$8 billion alongside \$1 billion in funding for Obama-care and a host of hidden special-interest provisions, representing the worst kind of big-spending, big-government porkfest that has been all too typical of Congress in recent years. I strongly opposed this measure that would have worsened our debt crisis by forcing billions of additional debt onto the backs of future generations.

Fortunately, thanks to strong opposition from fiscally conservative members of the Senate and an outcry among House conservatives and the American people,

Democratic leaders were forced to abandon this destructive bill and instead pursue a short-term “continuing resolution” that will simply keep the government running at current funding levels. I believe we need to do much more to reduce spending and begin addressing our national debt. **I have supported plans to reduce spending to FY 2008 (pre-“stimulus”) levels as an important first step.**

This victory for the taxpayers would not have been possible if not for the American people sending a strong message that it’s time to stop the wasteful spending in Washington. House Republicans have pledged to end the practice of “Christmas tree” spending bills that contain billions of dollars in pork, along with extraneous provisions that have not been subjected to public scrutiny. As we move into a new Congress next year, I look forward to working with the new majority in the House of Representatives not only to block new spending like the omnibus bill, but also to begin the work of actually cutting federal spending back to more reasonable levels and getting our nation back on the path toward a balanced budget.

To involve more young women in the political process and to provide educational opportunities, the National Federation of Republican Women (NFRW) offers several scholarships and internships to female students.

NFRW Scholarships

In honor of Nancy Reagan, The NFRW offers three annual \$2,500 National Pathfinder Scholarships for college sophomore, junior, senior, or graduate school women.

NFRW also offers three \$1,000 Betty Rendel Scholarships to college junior and senior women who are majoring in political science, government or economics. The recipients are chosen from applicants from across the nation.

Dorothy Andrews Kabis Internship

The Dorothy Andrews Kabis Memorial Internship honors the former president of the NFRW (1963-67) who later was appointed U.S. Treasurer by President Richard Nixon. The internship gives female undergraduates the opportunity to spend part of the summer working at national headquarters in Alexandria, Va. It includes a small monetary allowance, roundtrip airfare to and from Washington, D.C., and housing in the D.C. metropolitan

area. Applicants must be at least a junior in college or a college student 21 years of age or older. They should have a general knowledge of government, a keen interest in politics, campaign experience, and sufficient clerical office skills that are adaptable to a busy office.
