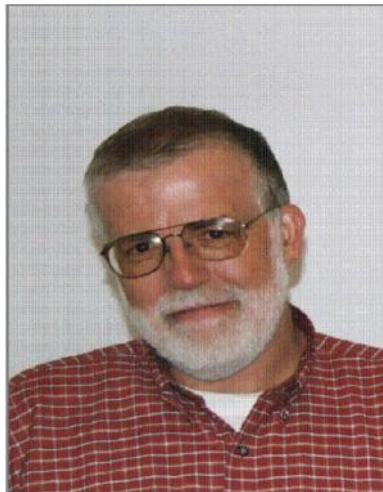

LEGISLATION UPDATE

An important bill aimed at influencing our state's youth will soon be heard in committee. Senate Bill 48, which was introduced by Senator Leno (D-3), aims to reword sections of the current Education Code. The current law prohibits its instruction that reflects "adversely" on anyone because of their race, sex, color, creed, handicap, national origin, or ancestry.

The new law would require social science instruction to include "a study of the role and contributions of Native Americans, African Americans, Mexican Americans, Asian Americans, Pacific Islanders, European Americans, lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender Americans, and other ethnic and cultural groups, to the development of California and the United States."

The bill also requires instructional materials used in schools to include materials that "accurately portray" the role of "Pacific Islanders, lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender Americans..." Any textbook that doesn't fit the current liberal idea of what is socially and racially diverse would be banned from use. Parents would not be able to "opt out" from gay, bisexual or transgender lessons for their kindergarten through high school aged children.

The California Federation of Republican Women's Voting Body voted to Oppose SB 48, which will most likely be heard in committee in early March. Please begin sending letters and making phone call to let your opposition be known now!

Hardworking Californians Cannot Afford a 'Crash Tax' **By Senator Tony Strickland**

Cities across California are passing 'crash tax' ordinances, which allow police and fire departments to send a bill to nonresidents who get into accidents within their city limits. Almost 60 cities have passed some form of these crash tax laws, most recently, the city of Sacramento.

The fact of the matter is these crash taxes are nothing but a double-tax. Local small businesses work hard to bring people to their city for shopping, food, and entertainment. People travel to other cities, they spend their hard-earned money there, and they pay the local sales taxes there.

It is the duty of local governments to provide public safety. If these cities aren't using sales tax dollars to provide public safety, then I have to wonder, where is that money going? Californians, regardless of the city in which they live, work, or visit, should be awarded certain public safety protections. They should be allowed to commute to work or travel to a neighboring city without having to worry about a bill waiting for them when they get home.

This is why I've authored Senate Bill 49. SB 49 would ban a local government from charging a fee or tax to any person, regardless of whether or not they live there, for the cost related to dispatching an emergency responder.

Luckily, it seems some cities that have enacted these crash tax laws are seeing that they provide no real benefit and

are working to repeal them. Roseville, north of Sacramento, recently repealed their crash tax law, stating that of the \$100,000 it was projected to take in, it only brought in \$40,000.

These crash taxes are unfair to all hardworking Californians who are already struggling to make ends meet. People can simply not afford yet another tax and people who work hard and who budget carefully should not have to spend their hard-earned money on a crash tax.

The fact is, these crash taxes are just another way for local governments to shift the responsibility of providing public safety over to the taxpayers. Californians are already taxed to the max and should not have to bear yet another burden.

**Senator LaMalfa Applauds Re-opening of Trinity River Lumber Company
(In Weaverville, CA)**

(SACRAMENTO) - Senator Doug LaMalfa (R - Richvale) applauds the re-opening of the Trinity River Lumber Company after a devastating fire destroyed their facility just 15 months ago. On September 12, 2009, a fire destroyed the mill and left many people unemployed. The ripple effect of the mill closure was felt throughout the region. However, the dedication and hard work of the Schmidbauer family has not only opened the state-of-the-art mill, it has also provided employment for 120 workers in a community that is desperately in need of jobs. "Due to environmental regulations and California's unfriendly business climate it would be understandable if Frank Schmidbauer would have closed the mill's doors," LaMalfa said. "Instead, Trinity River Lumber Company will continue to be a landmark and Key employer in the Weaverville community." LaMalfa honored the Schmidbauer family and Trinity River Lumber Company by presenting them with a Senate Resolution at the Annual Logging Conference held in Redding.

**Nielsen and LaMalfa Demand Fish and Game Department stop harassing
property owners/water users**

(Sacramento) - Assemblyman Jim Nielsen (R-Gerber) and Senator Doug LaMalfa (R-Richvale) have asked the Department of Fish & Game (DFG) to respond to allegations of government officials harassing water users in Northern California.

In a joint letter to Fish & Game Director John McCamman, Nielsen and LaMalfa seek a response to constituent concerns that, "DFG personnel are contacting water users and advising them that if they refuse to sign their Incidental Take Permits (ITP) permits, then they will not only have their water shut-off, but also may face criminal prosecution." Both Nielsen and LaMalfa express concern that, "This does not appear to us to be an acceptable method of working with the private landowners (they) represent, and may in fact be illegal under state law."

"The actions reported to me by constituents and elected officials in the area are unacceptable," said Senator LaMalfa. "These are honorable, long-time, families and farmers that are being abused by the whims of a bureaucracy that neither understands nor cares about what they do. I won't stand for this persecution and will fight them in every possible way."

"I am greatly disturbed by the responses I am receiving from my constituents in Siskiyou County," stated Assemblyman Nielsen. "No government agency has the right to threaten the people it is sworn to serve. I urge Director McCamman to meet with us immediately, so that we can resolve this issue, and allow landowners throughout Northern California to use their water without fear of prosecution."

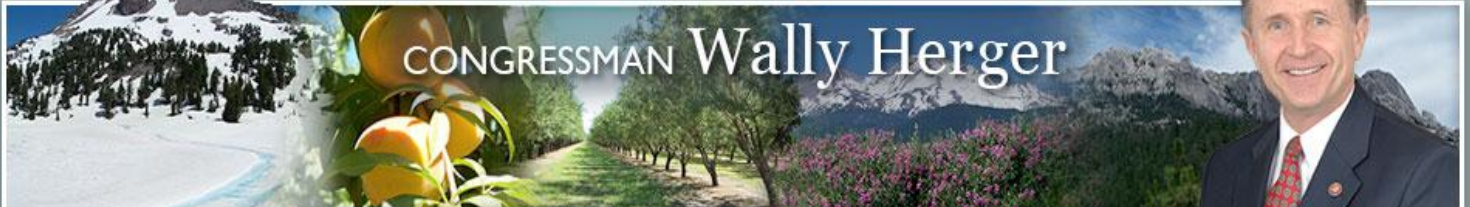

REMOVING BARRIERS TO PUBLIC ACCESS TO FEDERAL LANDS

Given your interest in our federal lands, I want to inform you that I offered an amendment to the FY 2011 Continuing Resolution funding bill to prevent the Forest Service from implementing the 2005 Travel Management Rule this fiscal year. The Forest Service has used the rule to shut down access to federal lands, which has generated a great deal of concern among local elected officials and recreation enthusiasts in Northern California and elsewhere in California. The amendment would impose a seven-month moratorium on designating routes under the travel management rule, creating a "time out" in which a new, more balanced plan can be developed that addresses the concerns of local communities. I have been a strong advocate of a more measured and responsible travel management plan, and I have repeatedly called on the Forest Service to look at the individual circumstances with regard to public access of federal lands. The House is expected to vote on my amendment later tonight. If passed, the funding bill must be approved by the Senate and signed by the President before the prohibition on further implementation would go into effect.

I spoke on the House floor in support of the amendment. The full text of my remarks appear below:

"I would like to offer an amendment, number 177 in the Congressional Record.

"Mr. Chairman I am offering this amendment after much frustration and a lack of responsiveness from the Forest Service to local elected officials and the recreation community in Northern California and across the nation. For a couple years now, I and the Northern Californians I represent have tried many times to work with the Forest Service as it has been implementing the 2005 Travel Management Rule. We have been completely ignored as the Forest Service presses ahead with route designations that in some cases will eliminate more than 90 percent of previous access.

"Local county boards are now at the point of considering litigation against the Forest Service to keep these federal lands open to recreation. It is disgraceful that they would have to spend valuable public funding to defend access to our national forests – not only against well-funded environmental activists trying to turn every acre of federal land into some kind of sanctuary – but against the very agency that is supposed to serve the public.

"For these reasons, I believe it is necessary to impose a seven-month timeout on designating these routes. Chairman Simpson, ultimately we want a workable solution, and I hope to work with you and Chairman Hastings to ensure a more balanced implementation of the travel management rule. I hope that my colleagues can support this amendment. I yield back my time."

CAPITOL ALERT February 18, 2011 Full house in the Senate

The Senate's got a full house again. The upper chamber's newest members -- Republican **Sharon Runner** of Lancaster and Democrat **Ted Lieu** of Torrance -- will be sworn in during this morning's session, which starts at 9:30 a.m.

Runner replaces her husband, **George Runner**, in the 17th Senate District, while Lieu replaces the late Senator **Jenny Oropeza** in the 28th Senate District. Both won the seats outright during special primaries Tuesday. That means all 40 Senate seats are now accounted for, with 25 Democrats and 15 Republicans.

For the record, 27 votes are needed in the upper house to reach a two-thirds majority.
