**AMERICAN HISTORY PARADE
"THE EDENTON TEA PARTY"**



On October 25, 1774, one of the first organized political actions by American women occurred in the town of Edenton, North Carolina, when fifty-one ladies gathered at the home of Mrs. Elizabeth King and signed a proclamation protesting the British tax on tea. Led by Penelope Barker, the patriots vowed to support resolves by the Provincial Deputies of North Carolina to boycott "the pernicious custom of drinking tea" and avoid British-made cloth until the tax was repealed.

The ladies of Edenton signed a resolution declaring that "we cannot be indifferent on any occasion that appears nearly to affect the peace and happiness of our country." The boycott was, they declared, "a duty that we owe, not only to our near and dear connections...but to ourselves."

It was a bold move in a time when it was considered unladylike for women to get involved in political matters. Unlike the participants of the famous Boston Tea Party, the Edenton women did not disguise themselves in costumes, but openly signed their names to their declaration "as a witness of our fixed intention and solemn determination."

At first the British sneered at the Edenton Tea Party. One Englishman wrote sarcastically, "The only security on our side...is the probability that there are but few places in America which possess so much female artillery as Edenton." They soon discovered otherwise.

LaMalfa Opposes Long Gun Registration

AB 809 Passes Out of the Senate on a Party Line Vote

Senator Doug LaMalfa (R - Richvale) voiced his fervent opposition to Assembly Bill (AB) 809 by Democratic Assemblyman Mike Feuer which would require the registration of all long guns in the State of California.

The bill, if signed, would create a new registry of all privately owned long guns. However, the existing hand gun registration has not kept criminals from committing crimes with hand guns. Canada, which has similar long gun registration to that proposed in AB 809, has proposed to abolish it due to the fact that it is expensive and ineffective.

This bill was introduced in the last session as AB 1810 and was defeated in the Senate, but AB 809 is now on its way to the Governor's desk for his signature.

"I encourage all of my constituents to call Governor Brown and ask for his veto on AB 809 to avoid infringement on law-abiding citizens' rights," said LaMalfa. "Criminals don't obey laws and they will continue to obtain and use long guns. This law would only punish law abiding citizens and will do nothing to increase public safety."

"When guns are outlawed, only outlaws will have guns," said LaMalfa.

CORRECTION: In the September 9, 2011 issue of the Capitol Update, it was incorrectly stated that if the Governor does not act on a bill sent to his desk, it fails. The correction is if the Governor does not act on a bill sent to his desk in 30 days it PASSES and becomes law. We are sorry for the confusion. Thank you for understanding.

Here is a short list of other bills passed by the legislature and on their way to the Governor's desk. Republicans in both the Senate and the Assembly tried to block these measures, but unfortunately their efforts were futile. The Democrats have the majority they need to pass harmful legislation with votes right down party lines. I hope that these bills make your blood boil and next legislative session you will volunteer to help the CFRW Legislative Advocate and our Republican representatives fight against the rampant liberalism embedded in Sacramento.

AB 1389 (Allen, D-9): This bill would prohibit police officers from conducting sobriety checkpoints and vehicle inspection checkpoints simultaneously, making it more difficult for officers to safely determine whether a driver has been drinking or not. The supporters of the bill claim that illegal immigrants are unfairly targeted because they drive without licenses, which is cause for vehicle inspection and/or impoundment.

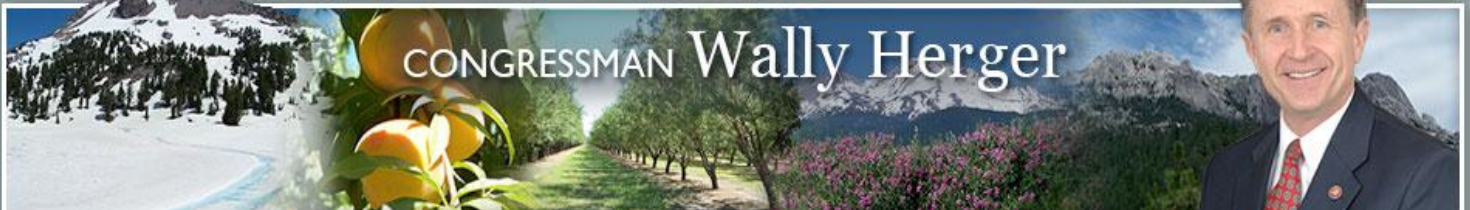
AB 1053 (Gordon, D-21): As a "revenue generator," this bill would increase the fees for both death and birth certificates by \$6 each.

AB 144 (Portantino, D-44): Passed along party lines, AB 144 would make it a misdemeanor to openly carry or transport an unloaded gun.

AB 809 (Feuer, D-42): Another bill infringing on our second amendment rights, this bill would create a government retained record of rifle sales. If passed it will take effect in 2014. The assumption is that sales to criminals will also be recorded, unfortunately criminals tend not to obtain guns legally.

AB 101 (Perez, D-46): The now infamous "Babysitter's Bill", AB 101 would allow the child care providers who receive state subsidies for their services the ability to unionize.





REPORT FROM WASHINGTON

Administration Seeks Congressional Input to Halt Drug Cultivation on Fed Lands
September 16, 2011

The director of the Office of National Drug Control Policy (ONDCP) recently requested members of Congress to assist in the annual development of the national drug control strategy. This week I responded with a letter urging ONDCP to develop a comprehensive and coordinated strategy to permanently dismantle drug trafficking organizations operating on federal lands. In particular, the threat of marijuana cultivation on federal lands and the dangers posed to local communities by the cartels involved should be eliminated as soon as possible. This is a critical issue in our Northern California federal lands. I also requested ONDCP to follow up on a House-passed resolution I authored last year that called on the federal government to take more aggressive and persistent actions to dismantle these organizations.

I appreciate the collaborative efforts law enforcement has already taken, such as the recent Operation Full Court Press through which over 100 people were arrested in six Northern California counties. My concern remains, however, that these successes will ultimately be short-lived without a strategy to permanently end trafficking on federal lands. As the ONDCP develops its annual drug control strategy, I sincerely hope that it includes the need for a comprehensive plan to dismantle DTOs operating on public lands, and I will be sure to report back on the director's progress in developing that plan.

President's Jobs Speech Should Look to Past Successes
September 8, 2011

President Obama is scheduled to deliver a speech tonight on job creation before a joint session of Congress. Sadly, over 20 million unemployed Americans are looking for a job but can't find one or have given up their job search entirely. Early reports indicate that the President will call for a \$300-\$400 billion package made up of tax credit extensions and more infrastructure spending. I'd like to share what direction I believe the President should pursue to restore the American economy and create jobs.

The building blocks for economic growth and job creation that have made America the leader in the global economy are well known. Our previous economic success has been accompanied by a commitment to the ingenuity and innovation of our entrepreneurs, a government that avoids picking winners and losers in the free market, and tax policies that allow American businesses to use their

money to grow and hire workers instead of sending it off to Washington. The most recent unemployment report shows that zero jobs were created last month. Government spending will not lift us from this economic quagmire. I hope the President's speech will outline a plan acknowledging that the big-spending 'stimulus' policies have failed and returning to the principles that have proven to drive economic growth in our nation.

We need to restore certainty for small businesses and rebuild the confidence of consumers. In order to do so, we must eliminate the burdensome regulations and uncertain tax policies that have stalled our economy and job creation. In the short term, the President should submit to Congress for approval the three pending trade deals with Colombia, Panama, and South Korea – a move that the White House itself says will create 250,000 jobs. We should audit existing and pending regulations to identify and fix those that hinder economic growth. The House has already passed legislation that addresses the negative impacts of the EPA's regulation of greenhouse gases, the Federal Communications Commission's net neutrality proposal, and duplicative and burdensome pesticide regulations. The President should offer his support for these initiatives. Moving quickly to eliminate unfair tax provisions, such as the [3% withholding tax](#) that threatens to impose new costs on every company that supplies goods and services to government agencies, will allow businesses to plan for the future with greater certainty.

Over the longer term, the President and Congress should work together to increase American competitiveness and investment by simplifying the tax code, eliminating special loopholes, and bringing down the overall top tax rate to 25%. Our efforts at expanding the global marketplace for American businesses should not end with the three pending trade agreements – we should continue to push to increase market access for U.S. goods and services across the globe. Further, we should be pursuing an all-of-the-above energy policy to increase domestic production in order to create jobs and lower energy costs. The President should also announce his support for a Balanced Budget Amendment, which the Congress will vote on this fall, to signal to the American people and entire world that the U.S. is serious about addressing our debt crisis.

We need to change our ways and get back to basics. America still is a great nation and with the proper stewardship we can reassert ourselves as the undisputed global economic leader. I hope that the President will heed the lessons of experience, turn away from what has failed, and work with Congress to embrace what we know will succeed.
